Anyone who has not been able to obtain a gown for the ceremonies or who may have a white gown to loan is requested to get in touch with Miss Gauger.

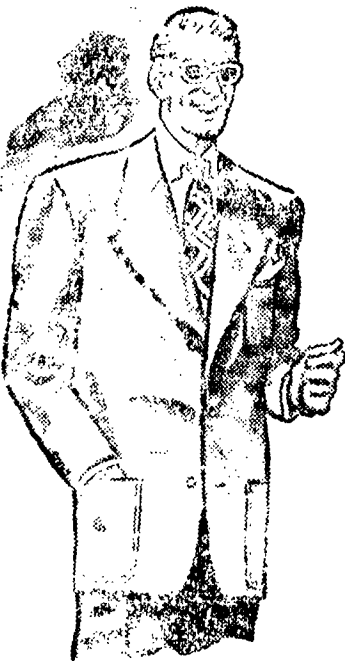

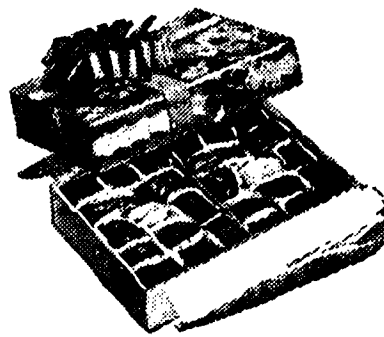

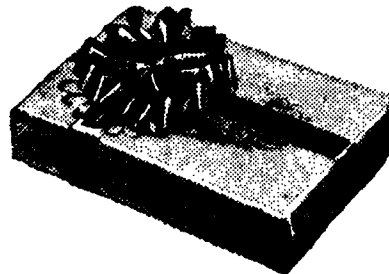
