

# Lion Nine Triumphs, Blankets Villanova, 9-0

## Miller Gains Fourth Win As Wertz Gets 3 Hits

Righthander Cy Miller and first baseman Dick Wertz combined talents yesterday and led Penn State's rampaging baseballers to a 9-0 whitewash over Villanova. The game, the sixth straight win for the Nittanians, was played on New Beaver Field.

Miller came through with a topnotch pitching performance. The slender moundsman allowed only four hits, and not a single Villanova runner reached second base.

### 3 HITS

Wertz, who was hitting .394 before today's Wildcat feast, slammed out two singles and a double to lead the Nittany nine at the plate. Miller himself smacked two bingles.

State took a one-run margin in the first when Joe Tocci walked and held up at third on Wertz's two-base clout to right center. Moroney, Wildcat pitcher, walked both Owen Dougherty and Jack Kurty to force in a run.

The Lions tallied four times in both the second and third frames. Singles by Miller, Wertz, Dougherty and Kurty, walks to Hen Al-

bright and Bill Tegtmeier, and an error by the Villanova catcher accounted for the second inning scores.

### BIG INNING

Two more Villanova errors, Hackman's steal of home and three singles pushed four additional scores across the plate.

Spectacular fielding by the Nittany infield aided Miller greatly. The Hackman-to-Tocci-to-Wertz combo clicked for two twin killings. Captain Hackman at shortstop handled twelve chances without an error.
