

# West Chester to Provide Booters Strong Opposition

North Caroline and West Chester Teachers College are two new soccer aggregations that the Lion booters will encounter in their 1949 schedule.

Next Saturday, October 1, the charges of Coach Bill Jeffrey open their campaigning on the Nittany home grounds against West Chester.

Although only a comparatively small school, West Chester soccer teams are usually rated on the same plane with outfits of much larger institutions.

"We don't want to underrate them" the smiling Scot mentor states, "for they field good teams. We'll have our hands full next Saturday."

### Navy

Last year Jeffrey charges copied seven, dropped one and tied one. Navy, the only team to drop the Nittanics last season, is back again on the schedule along with Bucknell, Syracuse, Colgate, Maryland and Temple, the latter two are usually considered among the top booting outfits in the East.

Three tilts are carded for the junior soccer Lions, against Frostburg Teachers, Lock Haven Teachers, and Swarthmore Center. All three tussles are scheduled for the Nittany campus.

Jeffrey thinks that this "should" be a very successful season for State, with a big should, that is. He considered his 1948 team as his best the last decade, and expects the current booting edition to be even better.

### Outstanding Record

Holder of a soccer record that has never been surpassed in collegiate annals. Jeffrey in his 23 year tenure at Penn State has produced an amazing total of 96 wins against only 18 losses. Twenty-one contests ended, in ties.

Between 1926 and 1946 the Lions played a total of 118 games, winning 84 and losing but 15. The average score per game during that era was 3.3 to the opponents .78.

"The war years were pretty hard on our record," says Jeffrey, "in the 17-year stretch from 1926 to 1941, we only lost six games while in the five years between 1941 and 1945 we lost nine times."

### Lettermen

Although Jeffrey has 14 lettermen on the squad now, including two all-American halfbacks, Ralph Hosterman and Dick Hannah, he still is combing the campus for suitable replacements.

Transfer students and sophomores are urged to report to Jeffrey at the soccer field any afternoon.

# Thiel Reveals Phys Ed Terms

Glenn N. Thiel, associate professor in charge of required physical education for men, announced that all incoming students with sophomore standing must take at least two semesters of physical education.

Veterans will be exempted if their discharge occurred after April 1, 1947.

All students with four completed semesters at another institution are also exempted from taking the phys ed requirement.

### Non-Vet Sophs

All non-veteran sophomores must take a swimming test during Orientation Week. Those who fail their aquatic exam will be required to schedule swimming for three hours a week until able to pass the required standards.

The School of Physical Education encourages all incoming male students to try out for varsity sports.

Students trying for a varsity or junior varsity sport are automatically exempted from all physical education classes.

All sophomore students who fall under the phys ed ruling this fall should include gym shoes, socks, supporter, T-shirt and sweat suit in their equipment.

### Ticket Fee

Each male student who is enrolled in a physical education class must obtain a towel and basket deposit card at the Bursar's office in Old Main. The card costs \$2. This money is refunded at the end of the year if the student returns the towel and lock to the stock room in Rec Hall.

This ticket also entitles the student to free towel service all season as well as the use of athletic equipment in Rec Hall.

### GAME TIME

The Penn State—Villanova football game will start at 2 p.m. Saturday afternoon. Upperclass students will be admitted to the game upon presentation of matriculation cards at the gate. Freshmen and sophomores will be admitted upon presentation of Athletic Association tickets.
