#### Club Program

Under the club activities program, students may take part in badminton, bowling, bridge, dancing, fencing, golf, out-of-doors activities, the Rifle Club, and the Swimming Club. The intramural program operates through eliminations and a point system and annually awards championships in the various intramural events.

The present seating arrangement was passed Feb. 19, 1949, by the Athletic Advisory Board of the College, composed of a College trustee, five alumni, four faculty, three students and two ex-officio members. One dissenting vote was cast. The board decided that "in view of the scheduling of games that were desirable to an institution of this size, and the financial problems involved, students should be seated in the east stand extending from mid-field to north stand, depending upon enrollment."
