

Gridders Scrimmage Run Formations in Rain

A cold, driving rain that turned New Beaver practice field into a soggy sponge yesterday hampered, but couldn't stall the day's grueling football drills as Head Coach Joe Bedenk continued to work the Lions hard, preparing them for Saturday's tough grind against Army at West Point.

With water running off their helmets, soaking jerseys and molle-skins, the gridders splashed through pass defense tactics, play formations, mock scrimmages, and hardening-up maneuvers; then hit a short scrimmage, probably the last one of the week.

The rain particularly slowed down backfield ball handling and passing practice, but Bedenk and his assistants made the difference by extra stress upon tackling, blocking, and running. The large gallery that usually watches action took a day's rest and the gridders worked almost a secret session.

GOOD CONDITION

Good squad condition and determination to climb back on the winning wagon will be on the Blue and White's side when they hit the Cadets at Army's Michie Stadium this week. Shock of that opening-day loss to Villanova still shows, but as they shake it off in practice sessions, the Lions pick up more of that confidence that bodes evil for opponents.

For the first time in weeks, injuries aren't the main worry of the coach. Only Ray Hedderick, first string center, is out of the scrimmages at this time, and reports yesterday pointed up that he might be ready for at least part-time duty in Saturday's contest. Hedderick, who suffered a severe charley-horse during the Villanova game, is walking on the leg although he still favors it a little.

TRIO OKAY

Fran Rogel, Vince O'Bara, and Joe Drazenovich, who had to be used mainly for offense last week, are on the "virtually recovered" list and will be available for full-time duty. Rogel also sustained a slight shoulder bruise that won't, however, hamper his play.

Owen Dougherty, Chuck Beatty and the other slightly injured are all ready to see action. Clarence Gorinski, however, who was slated for second string fullback duties and punting chores, is still off the team with a painful shoulder separation incurred in the Bucknell scrimmage session two weeks ago.

Although talented center-forward Joe Lane is still under doctor's care with a sprained ankle and Webster Haag, a promising looking fullback suffered a broken wrist during a recent scrimmage session, things are still pretty bright for the 1949 soccer aggregation.

Shifting Clarence Buss from his right flanking spot into center and moving Don Voxel into the position left vacant by Buss, the Jeffrey-front-wall is still one of the most potent ever.

DIAMOND PERFORMERS

Jack Kurty, an outstanding newcomer to the soccer field, is being groomed by Jeffrey to team up with veteran Chuck Margolf at fullback. Both Buss and Kurty were the alternating starting catchers for Coach Joe Bedenk's baseball-nine last spring.

With Ed Watson having to retire from the soccer field due to a trick knee, the battle for the starting goalie position has been thrown wide open.

Tennis-player George Lawther and track-star Ron Coder, both neophytes at the booting sport, are trying to get Jeffrey's nod for the post.

Since Coach Jeffrey has more

talent than needed in his half-back positions, last year's jayvee standout Bill Yerkes has been switched to fullback.
