Other jobs include Students work through a central office in meeting their needs.

Last year the agency had approximately 1600 applicants, and from September to June it found 7000 jobs for the students. This year it expects about 2000 applicants, and, according to Supervisor of Student Employment Allan Reece, jobs wil exceed the '48-'49 total. The agency has already handled between 700 and 800 applications this semester.

The Employment Agency operates on a priority system based upon the degree of financial aid needed and the semester standing of the applicant. All things being equal, the upper classmen will be given preference. These criteria are modified by availability, job proficiency, and the possession of skills as they relate to specific jobs.
