Blue Band To Stage Review For Fiftieth Anniversary By JANET ROSEN

Among the many alumni rooting for a Penn State victory on Saturday will be the sad-faced fellow seated at the left in this picture. For, in 1899, the time of the photograph, George Deike was a coronet player, who had organized the Penn State Bugle Corps. And now, in 1949, Mr. Deike is a trustee of the College, and his six piece ensemble has grown into the 90 piece, quickstepping Blue Band.

It was just 50 years when the Cadet Bugle Corps had its start. In the "good old days" when

Old Main was a barracks dormitory and male students took four tory and male students took four years of military tactics, the Commandant of Cadets, Capt. T. H. Taliaferro, was making his Sunday morning inspection of the barracks when he noticed a bugle hanging on the wall of George Deike's room. As a result of a demonstration

As a result of a demonstration of his bugling ability, Capt. Tali-aferro had him appointed chief musician; consequently, he was authorized to organize a bugle corps if qualified members could be found.

Thus, by October 1, 1899, the Cadet Bugle Corps was ready to operate with the following peroperate with the following per-sonnel: buglers, George H. Deik '03, E. E. Godard '03, Percy M. Snoeberger '03 and Edwin R. Norris '03; bass drum, John M. Craig '01; and snare drum, Fred P. Dodge '03. During that first year, the fore-sighted Corps members drew up a petition to the Board of Trus-tees requesting funds to buy 12 instruments for a cadet band.

instruments for a cadet band. But, the executive committee of the Board replied with regret that no College funds were available for such a purpose.


Debaters Add New Members To Varsity
