A register of those eligible for appointment will be established, with the results of the test being used to determine precedence. This register will serve as a "pool" of manpower upon which the various government agencies can draw for new employees.

Most positions to be filled carry a P-1 rating and an annual salary of \$2,974. This is for a five-day week, with 26 days of vacation leave and 15 days of sick leave, with pay, each year.


