

Lions Trample Cornell In X-Country Meet

Capturing the first eight places, Penn State's cross country team trounced Cornell's harriers by a perfect 15 to 50 score yesterday on the College course.

As in last week's rout of NYU, the Nittany runners were headed by Don Ashenfelter, who thus continues undefeated in State's intercollegiate competition.

Ashenfelter covered the five mile course in 26 minutes 49.9 seconds. He was followed by Capt. Bob Parsons, Bob Freebairn, Bill Ashenfelter, Jack St. Clair, John McCall, Bill Gordon and Al Porto, the last two tying for seventh place.

Coach Chick Werner, in commenting on the meet, expressed satisfaction with results, particularly the times.

Injuries Hit Lions, Spartans

East Lansing, Mich.—Injuries to key backfield stars, Fran Rogel of Penn State, and Gene Glick, the Spartans' ace passer, promises to take some of the spark out of today's battle at Macklin Field Stadium between the Nittany Lions and Michigan State.

There's enough riding on this sixth meeting between the two powerful intersectional rivals, however, to satisfy a thrill-hungry crowd, expected to jam the 50,000 seats available.

The Spartans are still smarting over the 14-14 deadlock the Lions fed them in the 1949 Penn State Homecoming game. This season Michigan State has romped three straight opponents, outscoring them, 104 to 27, after losing their opener to Michigan, 7-3.

The Spartans are favored to keep their string moving today but a revitalized Nittany Lion that has battered two straight rivals after losing to Villanova and Army, is eager to do a little upsetting of its own. A victory could put the Lions back into the running for national prestige.

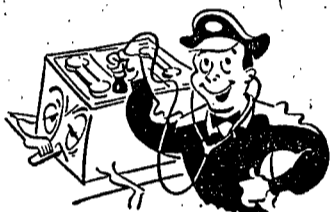
Booters To Try For Fourth Win

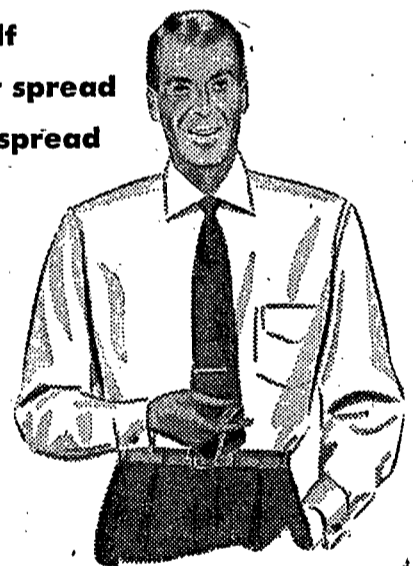
