In September, 1944, Rosner was sent to Liesing, Austria, a

labor camp.

"Every morning, we were taken in trucks to a factory near Vienna, returning at night," he

In March, 1945, as the Russian offensive became stronger, more and more Nazis left the camp. During the confusion of the last days, Rosner escaped, and after five days arrived in Salzburg.
