Miss Gauger and WSGA in deciding to continue the tradition expressed the hope that this affair could become of greater significance in the traditional life of coeds at the College than it has been in the past and that a large number of upperclass women would participate in order to make it a success.

In past years, visiting upperclasswomen, have "popped-in" to visit the inhabitants of the rooms they themselves had once occupied. However, because of the informality of this special night, visits may be made to anyone and for any reason.
