Cap Successful Season With Win Over Jaspers

The Penn State cross country team closed its successful 1949 dual meet season on Saturday with a triumph over Manhattan College and will now focus its attention on getting ready for the IC4-A and the NCAA meets.

Coach Chick Werner's harriers won their third victory of the season Saturday by a 26 to 29 count despite the fact that Manhattan's

Bill Lucas finished first. However, he was followed over the finish line by Penn Staters Don Ashenfelter, Bob Freebairn and Al Porto. This turned the tide in favor of the Nittany Lions.

The race was run over the Van Cortland Park course and covered five miles. Lucas traveled the distance in 26 minutes and 7 seconds. Ashenfelter's time was 26:12 and Freebairn's and Porto's were 26:19 and 26:22 respectively. In all the first 13 men finished within one minute of the winning
