

WSGA Drive Begins Today

With \$500 as a goal, the 21st WSGA Christmas Drive will get underway today. The drive will last until Tuesday, Dec. 6. Dormitory presidents are seeking 30 cents from each girl to achieve the goal.

Chimney boxes will be located in dormitory lounges, the Corner Room, and the TUB, so that anyone who does not have the opportunity to contribute through dormitory units, may add his share to the drive.

Three groups benefit from the drive. Part of the money goes to work here on campus. This is the money that goes into the Hetzel Fund, an emergency fund which aids men and women students by loans and gifts.

The second group which receives money from the drive is the Mifflin County Children's Aid Society in Lewistown. Contributory funds help provide toys and spending money for children adopted into families who can provide them with only the bare necessities of life.

The American Women's Hospitals are now working to relieve suffering among the civilian population of Europe through disease prevention and child help. This is the third organization which benefits from the Christmas Drive.
