the BX as were hired and that since students in the lower financial brackets generally attend land grant institutions, the 15 to 20 per cent savings on school supplies are vital to students here.

Publicity Needed

Promotion and publicity are important problems of the BX, according to Schweiker, since the BX has little money to spend on advertising and students' buying habits must be changed. The other major problem is obtaining a better location, Schweiker said.

He declared, "Until Mr. Kenworthy, Mr. Hostetter, Acting President Milholland, and the Board of Trustees realize that the BX and the College are working toward a common goal, the BX must fight an uphill struggle."

Kelly Places Third In Debate Tourney

College Debater John Kelly placed third with a superior score of 88 Saturday in the University of Pittsburgh debate tournament. Teammates John Meszaros and Donald Yenke also rated superior.

The question debated by teams from 16 colleges was "Resolved: that the United States should nationalize the basic non-agricultural industries."

Ratings were not awarded on a team basis. Using new rules, each man rated his opponent for every round. Debaters scoring above 90 were rated excellent and those between 80 and 90 earned superior standing.

Colleges represented by speakers winning the first five positions were: St. Vincent's, Westminster, the College, California State Teachers College, and Carnegie Institute of Technology.

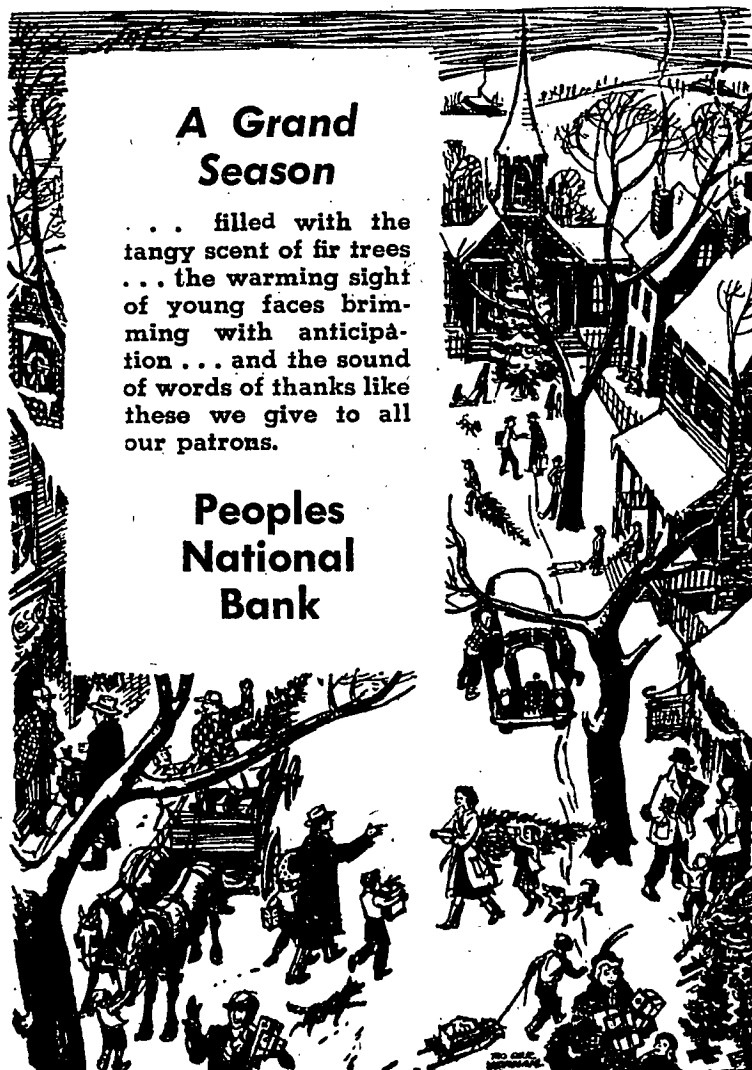
