mitted to share in the physical and moral good things of life, he told the audience in 121 Sparks. He termed India and Egypt as countries where revolution is possible because the ruling classes have not shown intelligence in dealing with national problems.

Frustration has been one of the major factors in the development of revolutionary leaders, he asserted, explaining that persons who are humiliated early in life and are denied an outlet for their abilities and emotions often will become aggressive and take their grievances out on society.

#### Economics Exaggerated

Although he would not deny the influence of economic motives on human action, Dr. Padover said that such influence has been greatly exaggerated. By ignoring human psychology, the

Marxists have failed to work out a truly scientific theory of revolutions, theirs failing to take into consideration a large range of human emotions which are not governed by economic self-interest, he contended.

The next lecture, on "The Psychological Approach to International Relations," will be delivered by Dr. Goodwin Watson, director of the World Study Tours, Feb. 17 in 121 Sparks.
