WRA basketball entered its final week of play on Monday night with the leaders of each of the nine leagues playing. Monday night's winners played Tuesday's contenders in elimination games. The same procedure will be used for the remainder of the schedule.

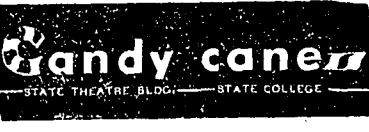
