Johnstown, Altoona, Harrisburg, Williamsport, Philadelphia, and later with DuBois. Official and Red Cross messages from Washington and Baltimore were also handled. Professor Crossley and eleven student volunteers maintained a full watch from 7 p.m., March 19, 1936 until 5 a.m., March 22, 1936.

War Flashes

The most momentous news flashes picked up and relayed by W3YA were those on the evening of December 7, 1941 when the news of Pearl Harbor was leaking out to a stunned nation.

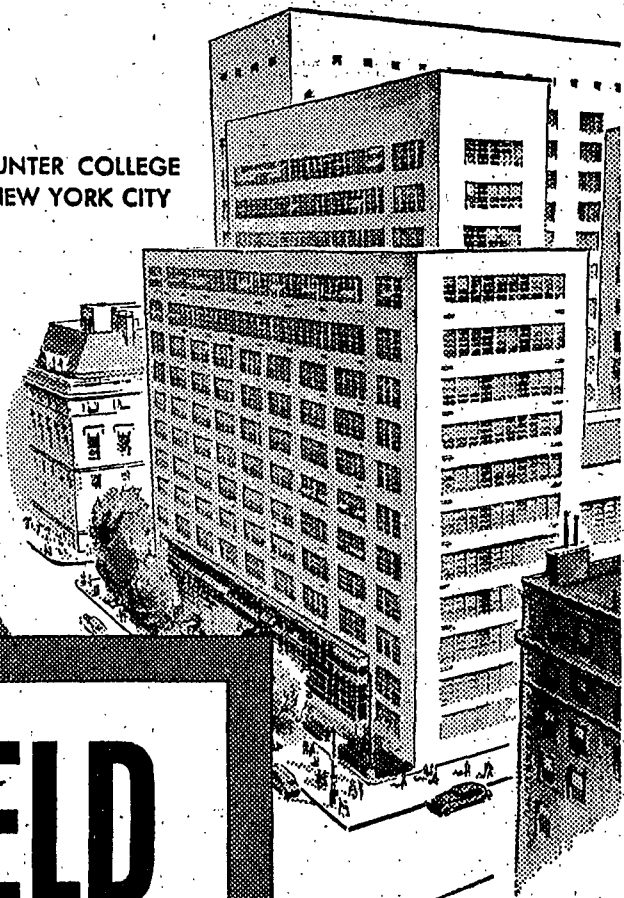
