(Continued from page one) his criticism to the College ambulance service.

"Many times," he said, "there has been no ambulance at football games. Dr. Alfred Griess, team physician, has been very happy with the service rendered by the campus patrol, the town ambulance, and Mr. Rishel, who drives the panel truck that masquerades as an ambulance for football games. Mr. Rishel is not, to Dr. Griess's knowledge, paid for this work.

"Mr. Hostetter has, according to Dr. Glenn, promised to get an ambulance by September, 1950. He favors a dual-purpose ambulance, according to Dr. Glenn, who wants no combination beer truck—meat wagon," declared Giesey.

To Investigate Inadequacies Giesey stated that the College has declared its intention to level off at an enrollment well above the one existing when the College Health facilities were obtained, he said.

"The situation is not grim," he concluded, "but it is certainly not what one might expect from an institution of some 10,000 students."

Ted Allen, All-College president, appointed Michael Cantwell chairman of a committee instructed to investigate what Giesey termed "present facility inadequacies." Remainder of the committee will be appointed during the coming week.

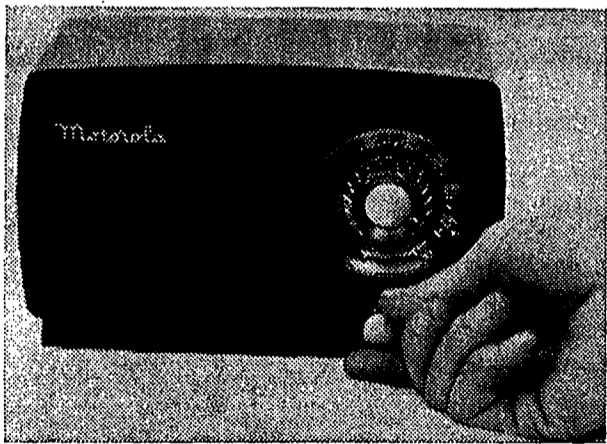
