

Winter Sports Take Final Dual-meet Fling

Swimmers, Wrestlers Open Weekend Card

Princeton's wrestling team visits State College tomorrow to close the Nittany 1950 mat season. The Lion-Tiger battle will start at 2 p.m. in Rec Hall, the initial activity of Penn State's final big sports weekend.

Coach Bill Gutternon's swimmers will also see action tomorrow afternoon. The State tankmen meet Virginia at 2 o'clock in the Glennland pool. Tomorrow night, the Nittany boxers will slug it out with Virginia's ringmen in Rec Hall at 7 o'clock, followed by the court clash between the Lions and Georgetown's basketballers at 8:30 o'clock.

The Tiger matmen have won five and bowed only to powerful Rutgers and Lehigh. The Orange and Black crew is heavily fortified in the lower weight classes, and on these divisions hinge the outcome of tomorrow's struggle. Captain Davie Poor, 128-pound EIWA champion, heads the visitors. His battle with Jack Dreibelbis will top the afternoon's schedule.

Other top-notchers for Princeton are Dave McAlpin, 121-pounds; 136-pound Bob Sellers, EIWA fourth placer in 1949, and heavyweight Redmond Finney, who recently upset Lehigh's Gus LaSasso, 6-4.

Boxers Meet Cavaliers

In the season's boxing finale, Penn State's ringmen will host Virginia in a Rec Hall dual meet scheduled for 7 o'clock tomorrow night.

The Cavaliers opened their current campaign with a 6-2 defeat against South Carolina but since then have deadlocked Miami and Army by identical 4-4 counts.

Currently the Cavaliers are riding high on a two-meet victory string, having decided the Citadel and Syracuse by 4½-3½ margins.

Virginia's blitz-duo of Allen Hollingsworth and Grover 'Bat' Masterson, plus their veteran Captain Joe Miragliotta form the backbone of the Cavalier unit.

Hollingsworth, the current 130-pound Eastern kingpin, won his second EIBA title last year by

outpedalling Penn State's Captain Johnny Benglian for the title at Rec Hall.

Masterson, the 135-title holder also is a two-time Eastern champ having won 130-pound laurels two years ago at Virginia.

Cagers Clash With Hoya

Penn State will attempt to close its 1949-'50 season with win No. 13 when the Lion cagers oppose Georgetown in the Rec Hall tomorrow.

Wednesday night the Nittany passers were dealt their tenth loss as West Virginia came through with a hotly-contested 59 to 56 win at Morgantown. The Mountaineers had entered the game with a record of never having been beaten by a Penn State basketball team on their home floor.

The Lions were severely handicapped through the inability of Guard Marty Costa to play up to his usual form against the Virginians.

Costa had been averaging about 14 points per contest over a 21-game route but prior to the game the Nittany co-captain contracted a heavy head cold while playing in New York. He was held to a single field goal before fouling out with 11 minutes to go.

STATE 'BLOWS' LEAD
With 10:15 remaining in the final half, Penn State held a 50 to 43 advantage, the widest margin either team could muster all evening.

The Mountaineers started banging away at the Lions' lead, finally tying the score at 50-all on a peep shot by Joe Duff and Dave Steindler's free throw. The Lions scored with 7:18 remaining and Harry 'Moo' Moore countered on

a jump shot. Ted Panoplos tied the count at 52-all but Moore's set-shot from the side gave the Hillbillies their deciding markers.

Moore set the pace for both teams with 21 points followed by teammate Mark Workman, Soph center, with 17. Lee Schisler paced the Nittanians with 7 field goals and 2 foul conversions for 16 points. Ted Panoplos and Lou Lamie each produced 12 tallies and Joe Tocci captured 10.

Gymnasts To Depart

Penn State's gymnastics corps takes off at 1 o'clock this afternoon for Temple and the last dual-meet of the Nittany schedule. The meet will also be the last dress rehearsal for next week's Eastern Intercollegiate.

The Lions will take their usual underdog role tomorrow. Temple, with a strong and well-balanced team, has been defeated by only Army and Syracuse this season; the Owls downed Navy, Delaware and West Chester.

Nittany Coach Gene Wettstone pointed out side-horse performer, Joe Beranato, high-barman Bill Willard, ringman Wally Hayes and parallel-barman John Keosian as the toughest of the Owls. State, he said, should have a good chance to take the rope-climb and tumbling.

Trackmen Enter K of C

Penn State's newly crowned IC4-A champions, Captain and hurdler Jim Gehrdes and high jumper Vic Fritts, will lead a

In addition to Gehrdes and Fritts, Coach Chick Werner has chosen Wil Lancaster and the mile relay team to run for the Nittany thinclads. Wil, who finished fourth in last week's IC meet, will go in the dashes.

The veteran sprinter will also run a leg of the mile relay. His mates on the eight furlong run will be Bill Lockhart and Guy Kay and either Gehrdes or newcomer Bill Polito. The mile relay team set a new Penn State indoor record of 3 minutes 22 seconds in the New York A.C. meet.

Ex-Lions Curt Stone and Horace Ashenfelter have a busy weekend ahead of them. They will run in a special two mile at the Heptagonal meet in Boston on Friday night, and at the Knights of Columbus meet Saturday. On Monday the former Nittany tracksters will go to Montreal, Canada and once again Stone will run the two mile and Ash the mile.

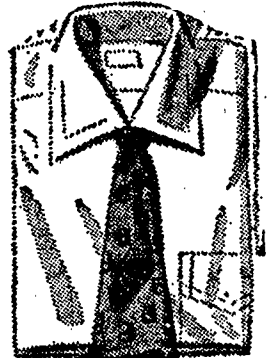
First Since '41
