

# Syracuse Dominates Early Boxing; Albarano, Gross Triumph for State

SYRACUSE, N.Y., March 10.—Syracuse, defending champion and pre-meet favorite, advanced four men into the semi-finals and one into the finals of the Eastern Intercollegiate Boxing Association tournament, but John Albarano, Penn State's 135-pound sophomore sensation scored a 30-second technical knockout to advance into tonight's finals.

Frank Gross, another sophomore, boxed his way into this afternoon's semi-finals, while two Lions, 125-pounder John Hanby and 155-pound Lou Koszarek dropped decisions.

The semi-finals will be broadcast over WMAJ beginning at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon. The finals will be aired beginning at 8:20 p.m.

George Kartalian, 175, Syracuse, decided Penn State's Jack Bolger in the last fight of the night.

Three other Penn State mittmen, including heavyweight champion Chuck Drazenovich, drew byes from the first round of competition. Also free from first-round action were Harry Papacharalambous, 135, and Paul Smith, 165.

It took Albarano only 30 seconds to pound his way into tonight's final with Tim Curley, Syracuse's 1949 145-pound champion who is now campaigning in the 135-pound division. Albarano sent Catholic U's Joe Incarnato to the canvas with a short left hook and a right uppercut to the jaw early in the first round. Referee Henry Lamar stepped in and stopped the bout after 30 seconds.

Gross fought a slow battle, but managed to outpoint Larry Lucas, Army, to move into today's 145-pound semi-finals. Gross will face Western Maryland's Harry Lafue, whom he defeated in dual meet competition.

Both boys were cautious, but Gross was given points for his aggressiveness against his taller opponent. Unable to get in close, Gross was forced to fire at long range.

Jim Huba, Syracuse, reversed a decision Hanby gained over him in a dual meet earlier this season by virtue of two good rounds. Huba opened the first round with two hard lefts to the head and in the second period hit Hanby with a hard left and a stinging right to the face. Huba will face Leonard Coiner, Virginia, in one of today's 125-pound semi-finals.

Joe Miragliotta, Virginia captain who last week drew with Koszarek, jabbed his way to victory over the hard-hitting sophomore in a 155-pound battle. Koszarek rallied in the final round, but the Virginian had piled up too much of a lead in the early frames.

One of four defending champions entered in the tournament, Drazenovich will face the winner of the bout between Western Maryland's Joe Carlotto and Catholic U's Gene Higgins in one of this afternoon's semi-finals. The other semi-finalists are Marty Crandell, Syracuse's N.C.A.A. heavyweight champion, and Army's Bill Kellum.

Papacharalambous, in his first Eastern tourney, will face Catholic U's unbeaten Jack Redmond in a 130-pound battle this afternoon.

## Three Nittany Matmen Qualify for Semi-Finals

**BULLETIN — PRINCETON, N.J.** — Johnny Reese, 121, defeated Lou Bowers of Rutgers last night, 8-6. Reese will meet first seeded Mike Filipo, defending champion in the semi-finals today.

Defending champion Dave Poor of Princeton decided Jack Dreibelbis in the 128 pound class, 8-2. In the 136 pound division, Don Maurey pinned Bob Sellers of Princeton in 4:19 with a reverse nelson and chancery.

Captain Jim Maurey decided Nick Lorusso of Rutgers in the 145 pound class, 8-0.

PRINCETON, N. J., March 10.—Penn State, Rutgers, Yale and Syracuse, the defending team champion, each qualified seven men for last night's quarter final round of the 46th annual Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association tournament.

Only 155-pound Bill Slabonik fell by the wayside on the Nittany team. He lost a 6-1 decision to Rutgers' Charlie Calderaro.

John Reese, 121; Jack Dreibelbis, 128; Don Maurey, 136; Captain Jim Maurey, 145; Bill Santel, 165; Mike Rubino, 175; and heavyweight Homer Barr came through this afternoon's battles safely.

Don Maurey, Rubino and Barr scored falls for the Lions. As a result, the Nittanians were tied for third place in the unofficial team scoring with Franklin and Marshall, Navy and Rutgers. Each team had three points, one for each fall. Yale jumped into a quick lead with five points, followed by Syracuse and Lehigh, with four apiece.

Reese captured a 6-2 decision from Gordon Thomas of Columbia this afternoon. The Lion lightweight who was seeded fourth will take to the mats with Lou Bowers, Rutgers' strong 121 pounder.

Dreibelbis ruins smack into the defending 128 pound champion tonight in the person of Princeton's Dave Poor. In the preliminaries, Dreibelbis won, 6-2, over Pat Brian, Army.

Don Maurey, 136, flattened Don Dunn of Temple in 5:07 with a half nelson and crotch. Maurey was ahead 4-0 when he threw Dunn. Captain Jim Maurey was surprised momentarily by muscular Frank Scolpino, Navy, in the 145-pound duel. However, Captain Jim came on to cop a 10-1 decision.

Bill Santel, State's 165-pounder, had a narrow escape in his fight

with surprising Marc Rowe, Brown. At the end of the nine minutes, the two were tied, 6-6, but Santel was declared the winner by referee Dutch Lehman.

Rubino wasted little time with Columbia's George Von Hassell, pinning him in 2:38 with a reverse nelson and bar arm.

Barr pinned Penn's Austin Hepburn quickly with a body press. The time of the fall was 1:35.

Last night, Don Maurey went against Bob Sellers of Princeton, the same man he decided in a dual meet. Don's class is the strongest in the tourney. Yesterday morning the committee could not agree on who to seed, so they drew from a hat. Don was seeded an automatic fourth with Wayne Smith of Navy drawing the top slot.

Jim Maurey met Nick Lorusso, Rutgers, Santel challenged third seeded Dean Mulder of Army, Rubino and Bill McLarnin, Virginia, faced off, and Barr is slated to meet Keith of Harvard in the quarter finals.
