Panhellenic Votes No Frosh Rushing

A rule forbidding rushing of freshmen women next year was passed by the Pan-Hellenic Council at a recent meeting.

Members of the council expressed the desire to rush all sophomores at one time to provide a fairer opportunity to college women who spend the first year at a center. Members also felt the lack of interest of the freshmen women at the second semester formal rushing period showed a willingness on their part to wait for a year before joining a sorority.

The Council also passed a resolution to have only one formal rushing period a year. This would occur in the fall semester. Instead of having open houses at spring semester, the Council voted to have open bidding with no open houses.

It was decided to consider as eligible for rushing any upper-classman with a deferred grade, if her average were above a 1.0 quality point when the deferred grade was averaged in as a bar two.

The Council voted in favor of giving the Junior Pan-Hellenic Council \$100 for its treasury. The Council also approved the plan of awarding the Junior Council five dollars from each sorority every year to supplement its treasury.

Pan-Hellenic decided to keep fees for next year at the same.

Simmons Announces Fashion Study Tour

A European fashion study tour is now being planned for this summer to enrich the background of college students and others interested in fashion tour careers, the Prince School of Retailing, Simmons College, has announced.

Members of the group will leave New York early in July for Naples, and then will visit many places of fashion interest in Italy, France and Switzerland before reaching Paris, where a special curriculum has been planned by Travel & Study, Inc. The program is under the sponsorship of the Chambre Syndicale de la Haute Couture Parisienne, and will include lectures at the Paris Academy of Fine Arts, the Academy of Commercial Studies and the Sorbonne, as well as seminars and interviews at the most celebrated establishments of "haute couture", notably, Balenciaga, Chanel, Dior, Fath, Lelong, Maguy, Patou and Suzy. Fashion lectures will be delivered by Dior, Fath and Schiaparelli, among others.

The group will then go to England, Luxembourg, Holland and Belgium, returning by air to New York around September 1.

Further information is available from Dr. Donald K. Beckley, Director, Prince School of Retailing, Simmons College, Boston, under whose academic direction the trip will be made.
