Alpha Zeta and Sigma Chi gained two victories each in the IM wrestling tournament Thursday night.

Nine winners pinned their opponents including heavyweight Bill Harvey, Sigma Pi, who defeated 250-pound John Schwerling, Phi Kappa Psi, in 1:37 and Earl Bryant, Phi Kappa, who won from Jim Kelz, Kappa Sigma, in :57 of their 135-pound match.

Bob Seltzer, Pi Lambda Phi, won by forfeit in the 128-pound class.

Results in the 135-pound division showed Irv Taren, Phi Sigma Delta, winner over Jack Raker, Pi Kappa Phi, in 3:45 and Ed England, Tau Kappa Epsilon, a 7-4 victor over Max Smith, Sigma Nu. Larry Schniepp, Triangle, was a forfeit winner.

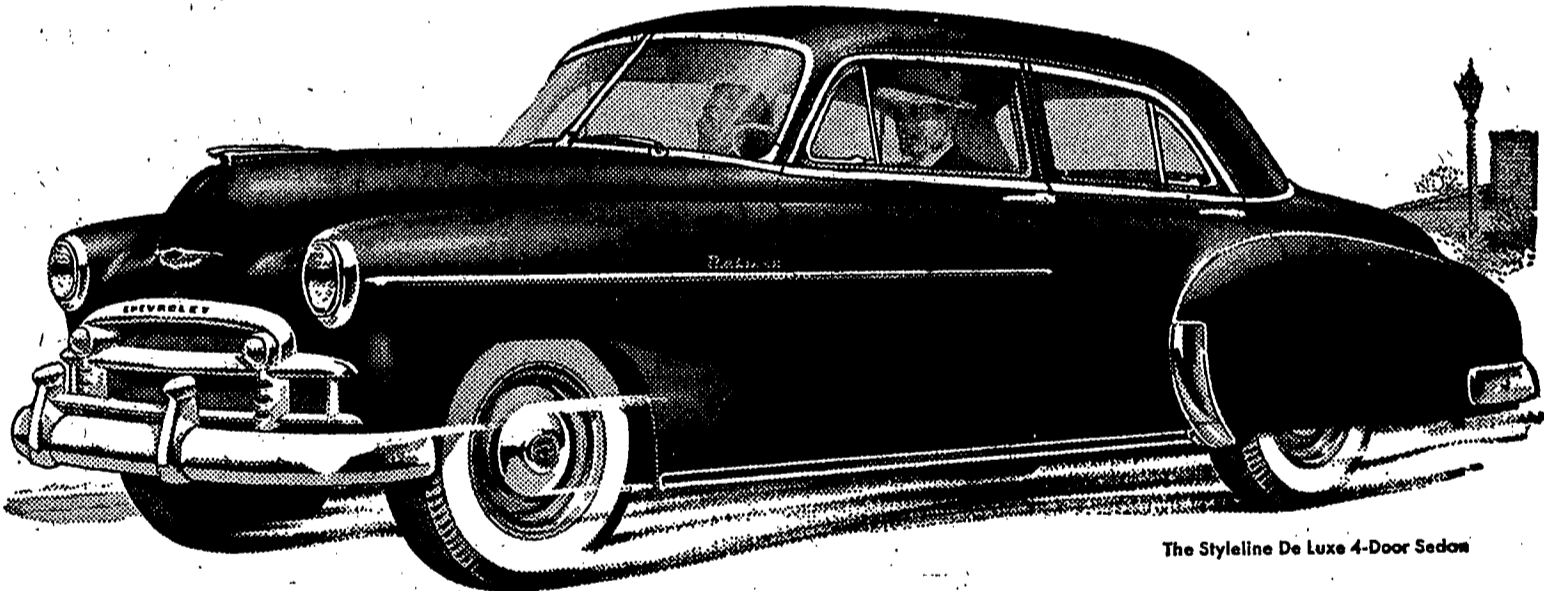
