

Red Cross; March of Dimes Net \$1172.50 From Students

The March of Dimes drive netted \$910.85 this year, according to Arthur L. Harnett, of the School of Physical Education and Athletics, who was chairman of the campus drive.

More than one-third, \$322.41 was collected at the basketball game Jan. 28. Of the remainder Simmons Hall contributed \$64.48. McElwain Hall, \$42.64; Unit 1, \$16.25; Unit 2, \$6.55; Unit 3, \$8.34; Unit 4, \$18.78. McAllister Hall, \$5.51; Atherton Hall, \$43.99; off-campus rooming houses, \$9.99; campus cottages, \$18.65; Jordan Hall, \$3.70; Watts Hall, \$4.55; Irvin Hall, \$8.42.

Campus offices and laboratories, \$61.46; fraternities, \$167.16; Pollock Circle, \$33.93; Nittany Dorms \$39.11. and miscellaneous, \$10.90.

Students whose names are included in the 1949-1950 issue of "Who's In The News at Penn State" may pick up their copies of the booklet beginning Monday at Student Union, Ed Watson, editor, announced yesterday.

Students of the College contributed \$261.65 to the State College Red Cross goal of \$6600, Robert J. Longenecker, College drive chairman, announced recently.

According to a breakdown of contributions, fraternities gave \$154.25; independent men, \$10.25; and women's living units \$97.15.

Complete community totals will not be announced until the town drive is over tomorrow night. The chairman reminded student organizations that late contributions can be made by check—payable to the American Red Cross—at the Student Union desk in Old Main.

Mechanical difficulties have held back the publication of the magazine, which is sponsored by Sigma Delta Chi, men's journalism fraternity and Theta Sigma Phi, women's journalism honorary.

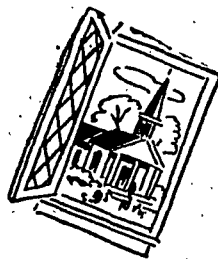

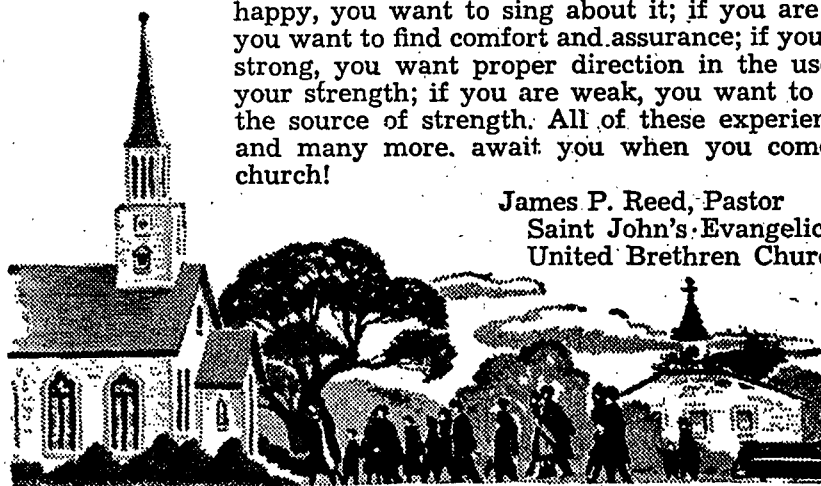
