 president John Senior said that it is "solely to inspire action by the groups" and that there was no force involved.
 The resolution as adopted reads, in part, "it is realized that fraternities must keep . . . the right of free choice . . . many fraternities are limited by nationally imposed constitutional restrictions . . ."
 "Fraternities . . . are chartered by a state endowed . . . institution . . . responsible to the people of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania."
 "Interfraternity council should not attempt to coerce any of its component organizations into action which would jeopardize their existence . . ."
 "1. Be it resolved that (IFC) . . . go on record as opposed to the existence of fraternity constitutional clauses discriminating against persons on the basis of race, religion or creed."
 "2. And that all member fraternities seriously consider this issue and take whatever action they deem advisable to have such discriminatory clauses removed."
 "3. And that yearly report on such actions be made to IFC by all fraternities whose constitutions contain restrictive or discriminatory clauses."

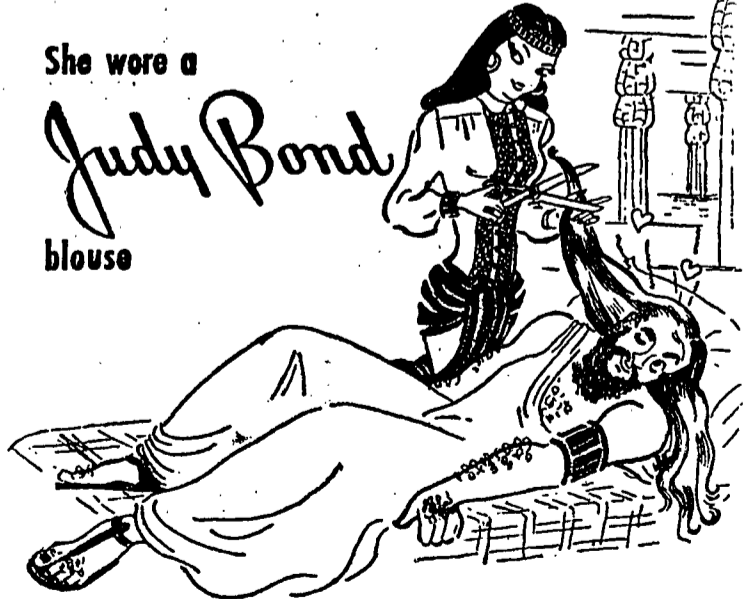

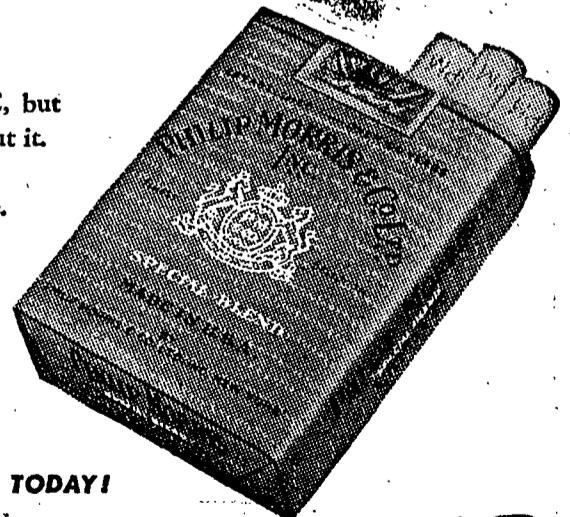
