in part, "it is realized that fraternities must keep . . . the right of free choice . . . many fraterni-ties are limited by nationally imposed constitutional restric tions .


"Fraternities ... are chartered by a state endowed ... institution ... responsible to the people of the Commonwealth of Pennsyl-

vania. "Interfraternity council should not attempt to coerce any of its component organizations into action which would jeopardize their DOUBLE ROOM available for weekends existence.

"1. Be it resolved that (IFC) go on record as opposed to the ex-istence of fraternity constitutional clauses discriminating against persons on the basis of race, re-

"2. And that all member fra-ternities seriously consider this issue and take whatever action they deem advisable to have such discriminatory clauses remov-

"3. And that yearly report on such actions be made to IFC by all fraternities whose constitutions contain restrictive or discriminatory clauses."


