

Tennismen Top Bisons For First Road Win

Penn State's net team won its first away contest of the season Monday as it scuttled Bucknell's tenniseers, 6-3, at Lewisburg. The match was a replay of the rained-out contest originally scheduled for April 19.

The marathon lasted four and one-half hours before the outcome was decided. With the approach of darkness the Bison management was forced to turn on the floodlights for the last few matches.

Captain Owen Landon captured State's first point with a 6-3, 6-3 win over Gray Rogers.

Number two swinger, Dick Wieland, downed the Bison's Drew Mathieson, 6-1, 6-2; Jim Howells swept through the third match by rallying for a 5-7, 8-6, 6-2 victory over Jack Koch; Mark Borland, after injuring his ankle in the opening set, also surged to defeat Bill Reitz, 6-8, 6-4, 7-5.

The first Bucknell point was scored in the fifth match as Nick Schloeder won a thrilling triumph from Spence Boyer, 5-7, 6-2, 4-6, and Ed Davis, number six, dropped his game to Jack Purnell, 6-1, 5-7, 1-6.

The racquetmen entered doubles competition leading Bucknell, 4-2. Wieland and Howells, Lion number one doubles combo, sewed up the match for their squad by trouncing Rogers and Mathieson, 6-1, 6-3, and number two duo, Landon and Davis, garnered point six by decisioning Koch and Reitz, 6-2, 8-6.

In the evening's finale, Charles Farrelly, a JV netter who was forced to play for the injured Borland, and Boyer dropped their match to Schloeder and Purnell, 5-7, 3-6.

The JV net team also won from Bucknell at latter's clay, 6-3.

Nittany Co-op banged out a 14-10 decision over McElmen on the independent card.



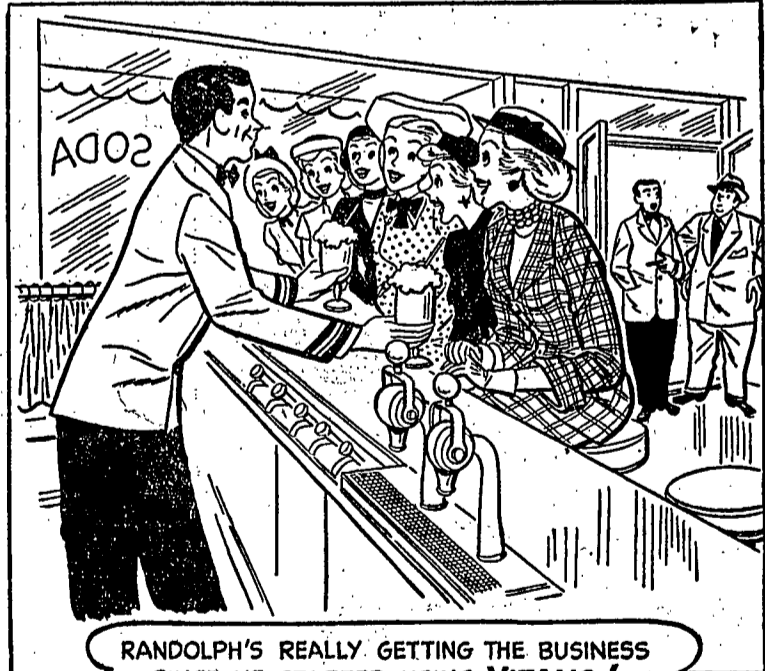
