

Syracuse Here For Twin Bill

Syracuse and Penn State diamondmen will tangle tomorrow afternoon in a doubleheader at Beaver Field. The first game will start at 1:30 p.m.

Bill Bair (2-0) will start the first game for the Lions. In the second game, Al Tkac is scheduled to go, but a torn ligament in his back is not responding to treatment and he may not be ready to take the hill. If Tkac is not ready, either Merle Gunnert (0-0), Bill Everson (1-0) or Dalton Rumberger (0-2) will start in his place. In any event, Herb Budin, who impressed favorably in relief against Bucknell, Monday, will be Coach Joe Bendek's fireman.

Five Ready

Syracuse will have five pitchers ready to go on the mound. The Orange will throw either Paul Royer, Gerry Ackley, Dave Bowers, Bucky Roché or Bill Michaels against the Lions.

The regular Lion lineup will see one change, that being in the outfield. Hen Albright, regular left fielder, is expected to be sidelined tomorrow. He has been suffering from a bruised shin this week which hampers his running. Bill Ondick will replace him in left.

Ondick, according to the latest batting averages, is leading the team with .750. Rumberger is next with .500. Tkac is hitting .428, while Jack Kurty is leading the regulars with .357. Captain Dick Wertz is leading his teammates in extra base blows with two doubles and three home runs.

Bair Lowest

Bair has the lowest earned run average, .98, for 18½ innings. Tkac is next with 2.82 in 54½ innings. The Lion infielders have turned in ten double plays with Wertz figuring in every one. On the deficit side, the same Lion infielders have committed 24 mis-

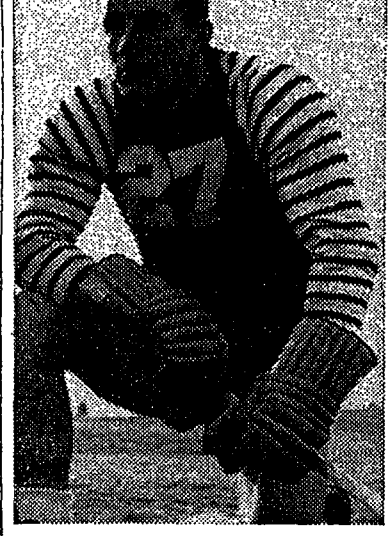
