

Nittany Batsmen Win 2; Trackmen Defeat Middies

Little's 8th Inning Homer Clinches 1st Game, 8-7

Bill Bair and Merle Gunnett combined to give the Lion nine a doubleheader win over Syracuse, 8-7 and 8-3, Saturday, at Beaver Field.

Bair, who won his third straight without a loss, was relieved by Jim Masticola in the ninth when the Orange rallied for three runs.

Owen Dougherty, Jack Kurty, and Harry Little combined to save the first game for the Nittanians. Little's home run in the eighth with none on turned out to be the winning marker. Syracuse turned two walks, two errors, a double, and a triple into four runs in the ninth to place the winning run on third.

Kurty tried to get Ken Johnson stealing and Joe Tocci let the ball through. Johnson broke for home but Dougherty heaved to Kurty who tagged out the runner and squelched the rally.

Gunnett had a no hitter going in the second game until the fifth when four straight hits accounted for the Orange's three runs in the abbreviated nightcap.

There were several pleasant surprises for Coach Chick Werner's Nittany team. In the javelin soph Ted Roderer came up with a heave of 206 feet 8 inches to capture the event and fulfill the promise he had previously shown.

The State men in the shot put all threw their best distances of the year. Newcomer Dudley Foster upset the dope by winning the two-mile run.


