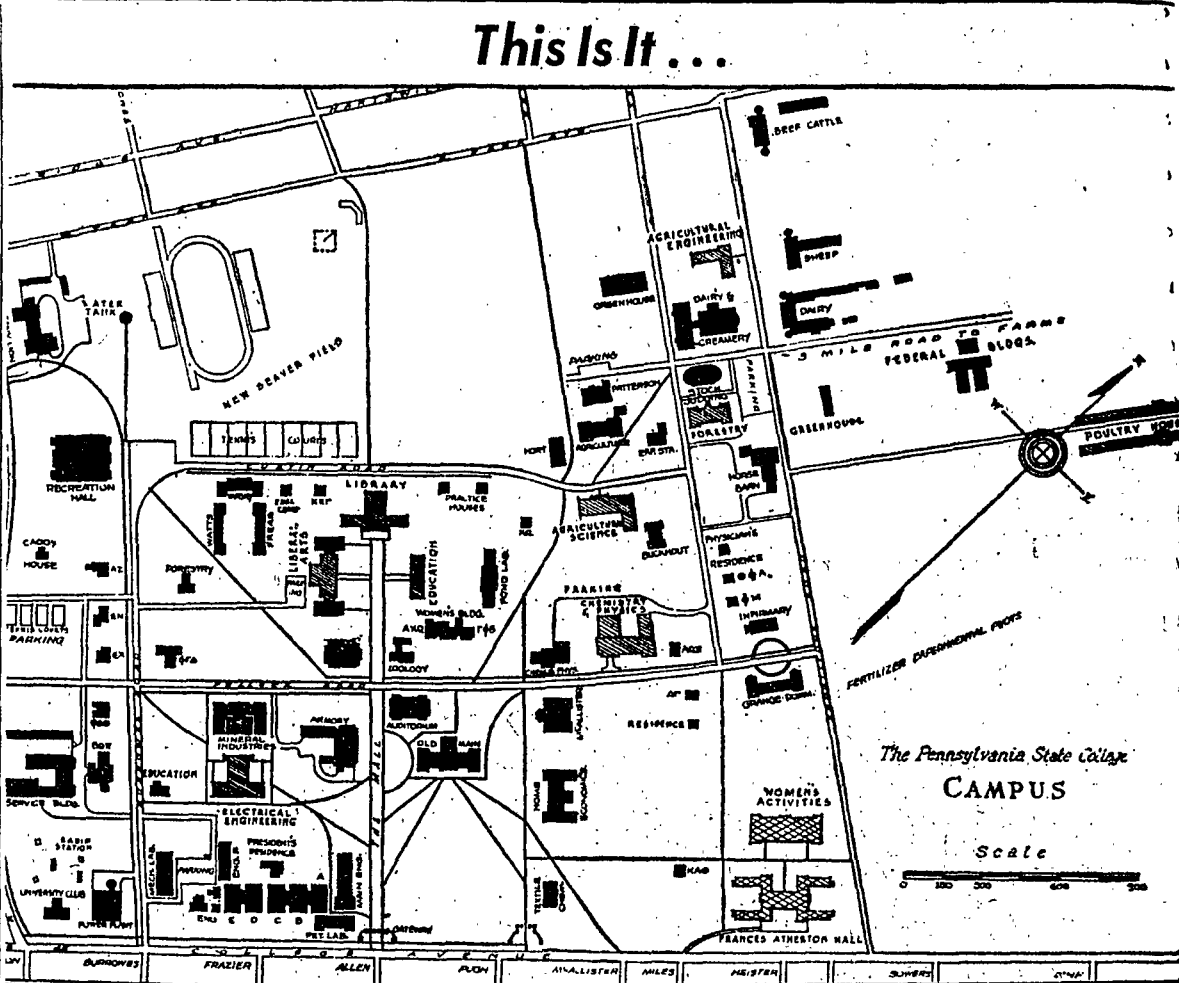
(Continued from page seven) hat societies, and the glee club, his main interest is in the Temporary Union Building.
