Dr. Charles M. Long, of the College of Education, Indiana University, was named professor and head of the department of education. He succeeds Dr. William E. Pratt, who resigned in 1948 to accept the presidency of Indiana State Teachers' College.

Dr. Henry W. Popp, professor of botany, who has been on the

College faculty for 29 years, succeeded Dr. Frank D. Kern as head of the department of botany.

Dr. Alfred G. Pundt, professor of European history, was named to a three-year term as head of the department of history. Dr. Pundt has been on the faculty since 1931, and succeeds the late Dr. J. Paul Selsam who died
