

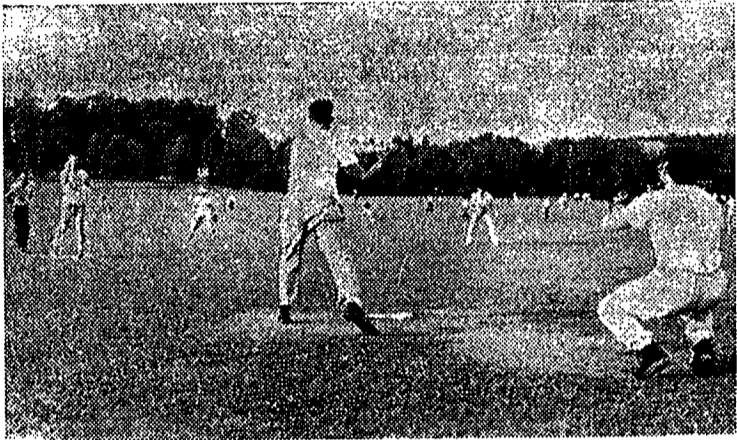
Collegians, Yahoos Await Titular Softball Struggle

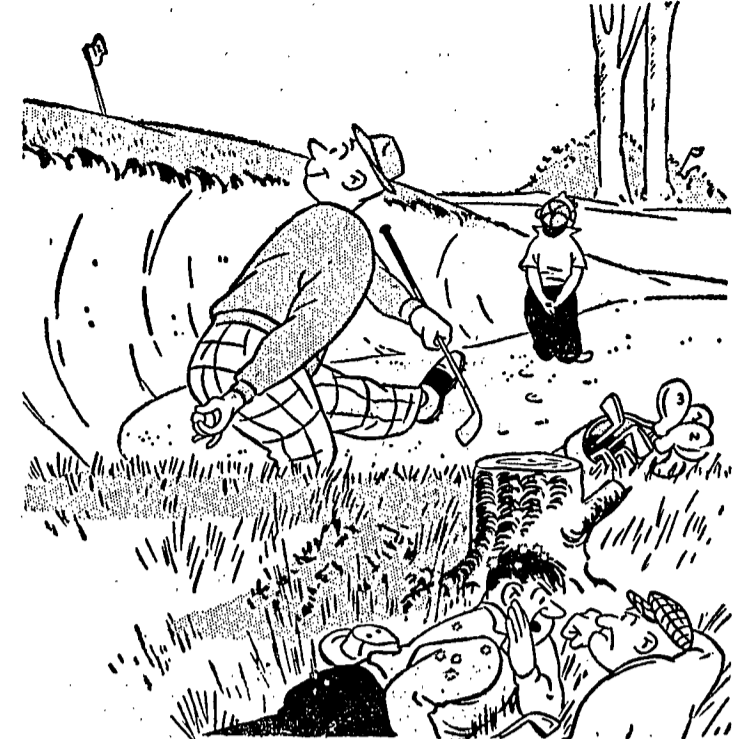
Fleming and Durbin are paired to determine the winner of the lower bracket.

Lion Court Team Accepts Spartan Tournament Bid; Releases 23-Game Card

For the second year in a row, the Penn State basketball team will participate in an inter-sectional tournament during the 1950 Christmas holidays. Last year the Lions reached the finals of the Dixie Tournament at Raleigh, N. C.

This year's plans were divulged by H. R. Gilbert, graduate manager of athletics, who announced a 23-game schedule, including the two-day Spartan Tournament at East Lansing, Mich., December 29-30. Princeton, Ohio State and Michigan State are the other teams enrolled.

Newcomers to the schedule, which will open against Ithaca College, December 6, are Ithaca, Rhode Island State, and Lawrence Tech. The Lions will play Lawrence Tech at Detroit, January 2, on the way home from the Spartan Tournament, while Ithaca and Rhode Island State both will appear on the home floor.

Last year's team, sparked by Marty Costa and Joe Tocci, both of whom were graduated in June, won 13 and lost 10, including the loss to North Carolina State in the Dixie Tournament finals. The 1949-'50 season brought the first coaching change in 12 years when Elmer Gross succeeded John Lawther as head coach.
