Despite the transfer to tackle of Bob Noppinger, an all-East end last year, Margarita can call on Dick Losh, Harry Schmidt, Gus Forniciari, and Art Pallotta, one of the East's crack quartet of pass-catchers.

### Hard-Hitting Fullback

Fullback Gino Paglucia, a tank-like sophomore from Massachusetts, has been going well in practice sessions, and will probably be the principal ball-toter for the Hoyas. Paglucia will have a trio of speedsters as stable mates. Bugs Thompson, Ralph Charney, and Jack O'Mahoney have shown enough ability at ball carrying to give any opponent the shivers.

Facing a rough nine game schedule this year, it is doubtful whether the Hoyas will improve on their 1949 record of five wins and five losses. Coming to Georgetown last year, the youthful Margarita began a rebuilding process very similar to that facing Rip Engle this year. Separated from 20 letermen, including most of last year's starters, the one-time Brown and Chicago Bear great is forced to start all over again.
