"Dutch" Sykes, assistant director of IM athletics at the College, today announced that the IM swimming office has received entrance blanks for 58 teams, 9 more than last year, with 406 individuals swimming a grand total of 292 "man-meets." Man-meets is the term proposed by the IM department to indicate the total number of participants in swimming although some men swim in several events.

Of the teams entered, 45 are fraternity and 13 independents. This is one of the few years in which the independents have been represented so heavily.

Delta Tau Delta, last year's champ, is reported to have another superb team entered this year which must be considered

among the top contenders for swimming laurels. Veteran backstroker Bob Johnson will form the nucleus.

This year's entrants give every indication of surpassing all previous ones in the 19-year-old history of the program. 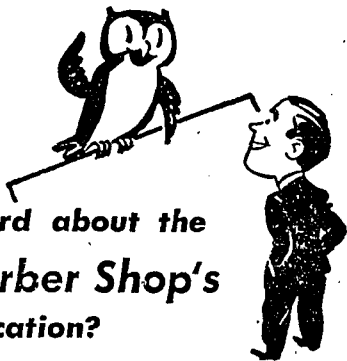
