

Trustees Approve \$6,000 Fellowship

A fellowship for the School of Agriculture, amounting to \$6,000 has been jointly approved by the trustees of the College and the Coke Oven Ammonia Research bureau.

The fellowship was established for work on fertilization and management practices on small grains.

Under the agreement, grants of \$2,000 annually for three years will be provided. The fellowship will be directed by Dr. Lawrence L. Huber, professor of agronomy.

The College also collaborated with the National Association of Automotive Mutual Insurance company to provide \$6,000 for partial payment of the Motor Vehicle Fleet Supervisor Training program.

Amos E. Neyhart, administrative head of the Institute of Public Safety, will conduct the program.

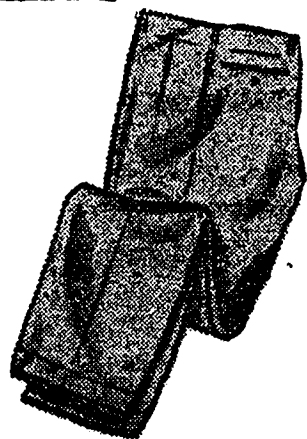
