(Continued from page four) guard on the next play and that was the end of that, although Bob Pollard momentarily rekindled the Nittany hopes seconds later when he intercepted a Custis-propelled pass and sprinted 55 yards before being hauled down on the Syracuse 39.

Tony Orsini and Shattuck chewed out a first down on the 25, but Koerber's pass bounced off the fingertips of Bill Barber and into the hands of Avatus Stone, who outstripped the startled Lions and went 85 yards for a touchdown.

That was the 11th time this season a Nittany aerial has been intercepted, but the first to lead to sudden disaster.

Within 55 seconds the Orange scored again when defensive right end Pete Lessar waltzed unmolested into the Lion backfield, snatched an O'Bara pitch-out and went 65 yards to the sheer delight of more than 17,000 Syracuse partisans. Bob Koleser converted for the third time in four attempts and the Orange had their first triumph over the Lions in 12 years.

The lone Lion touchdown came in the final seconds of play. Substitute halfback Bill Abbot broke off the right side of the line, cut back and raced 52 yards as the clock ran out.

Last October, the Department of Economics and Commerce revised its courses and a local petition for charter from the AKP Grand Council was granted.

No Restrictive Clauses

After passing the local petition for charter, the senate committee passed a motion to refuse a charter to any new campus organization having restrictive clauses.

The Alpha Kappa Psi Grand council then voted to remove the restrictive clause from its national constitution, and the action was sent in the form of a recommendation to the fraternity's 68 chapters.

Final vote on deleting the clause was not taken until the national convention met in September.
