

2500 Attend Open House At New Men's Dormitories

About 2,500 circulated through the lounges of the West dormitories Sunday afternoon at the first open house ever held in the new structures.

Invitations were sent to all campus women and about 150 administration officials and campus dignitaries last Wednesday by the Leonides-Panhel-WSGA-WRA-West dorms social committee, a semi-permanent group organized to run the affair.

Over half the women accepted the invitations. Most of the officials and dignitaries also came to the open house.

President Eisenhower was invited but was unable to attend because of the illness of his wife.

Lounges and recreation rooms in Hamilton, Thompson, McKee, and Irvin halls were open for inspection. Two combos made up of members of the AIM band provided music in two of the dorms. Pianists provided background music in the other lounges. Refreshments, cider and cookies were served in the recreation rooms.

A special traffic committee of 20 women and 20 men were on hand to guide and circulate the crowd. The dorm floor presidents formed a receiving line at the entrance to each of the lounges.

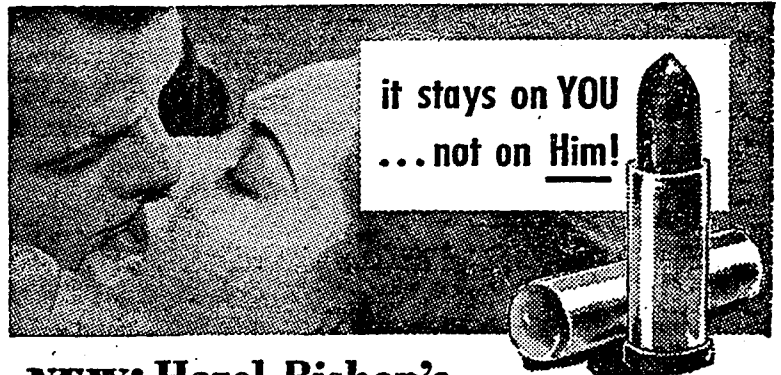
Phillips-Cohn
