

Mardi Gras Cup Won By AOPi; KD Is Second

Alpha Omicron Pi won possession of the Mardi Gras cup for the second consecutive year by selling 1,129 tickets at the Mardi Gras Friday night. Kappa Delta was second with 676, and Gamma Phi Beta was third, selling 527. Alpha Omicron Pi's booth was a show entitled "Round the World with the AOPi Dancing Girls." Kappa Delta had "Club Pigalle" and Gamma Phi Beta had a dart game called "Beat Boston."

Pat Heims Crowned King

Pat Heims was crowned king of the Mardi Gras, after he won from among sixteen candidates. Approximately 4500 votes, at a penny a vote, elected the king.

This year proceeds from the Mardi Gras totaled \$1139.69. This is almost \$400 more than last year's total. The profits will go into the Charlotte Ray Scholarship fund, which provides scholarships to needy women students.
