

Injuries May Bench Four Lion Gridders

Free from any major injuries until last week's Boston College game, Penn State's gridders may be forced to take the field against West Virginia minus the services of four important operatives.

Backs Paul Anders, Jim Pollard, and George Jacob are all troubled with shoulder injuries, and trainer Chuck Medlar will probably wait until late Friday afternoon before he decides whether the three will see action Saturday.

Medlar, however, termed defensive end Pat McPoland as "pretty doubtful." McPoland suffered a painful torn finger tendon in practice Tuesday and will probably have to sit this one out.

Should both Pollard and Anders be unable to play, Coach Rip Engle will probably start Ted Shattuck, his first-string fullback at the start of the season. After a good start, Shattuck cooled off considerably. The loss of both Anders and Pollard might hurt the Lion chances considerably.

While the injuries of Anders and Pollard have been diagnosed as slight shoulder separations, Jacob, starting defensive safety, is down with a torn shoulder ligament. He is the most likely of the four to miss this week's action.

In the meantime, Engle has been working the squad hard in an effort to polish up the offense—and add a few new twists to the winged-T—as well as ready the pass defense for the aerial onslaught of the Mountaineers.
