At that time Robert Higgins, retired football coach and now a goodwill ambassador for the College, baseball coach Joe Bedenk, wrestling coach Charles Speidel, and track and cross-country coach Charles Werner joined in criticizing training table procedure.

All varsity teams this year, however, have had their training table meals at a local restaurant, with the menu prescribed by the athletic trainer and doctor, Gilbert said. Present plans call for the training table to be switched to the West dining hall on Feb. 3, Gilbert said.

Commenting on Monday night's incident, Gilbert said he saw "no reason why the freshman coaches can't be finished in time for the boys to eat at 6."
