More than half—13—of Jeffrey's teams have gone undefeated. Five of his teams were untied as well as unbeaten, and from 1932 to 1941 the Lions went undefeated in 65 straight games to pile up one of the most amazing streaks in collegiate athletic annals.

#### National Champions

The Lion booters currently reign as national champions, having beaten the Purdue Soccer club, 3-1, in St. Louis in the second annual Soccer Bowl. In 1949 they inaugurated the bowl by tying San Francisco, 2-2.

In 1948 Jeffrey coached the United States Olympic team which stunned the soccer world by turning in a victory over England.

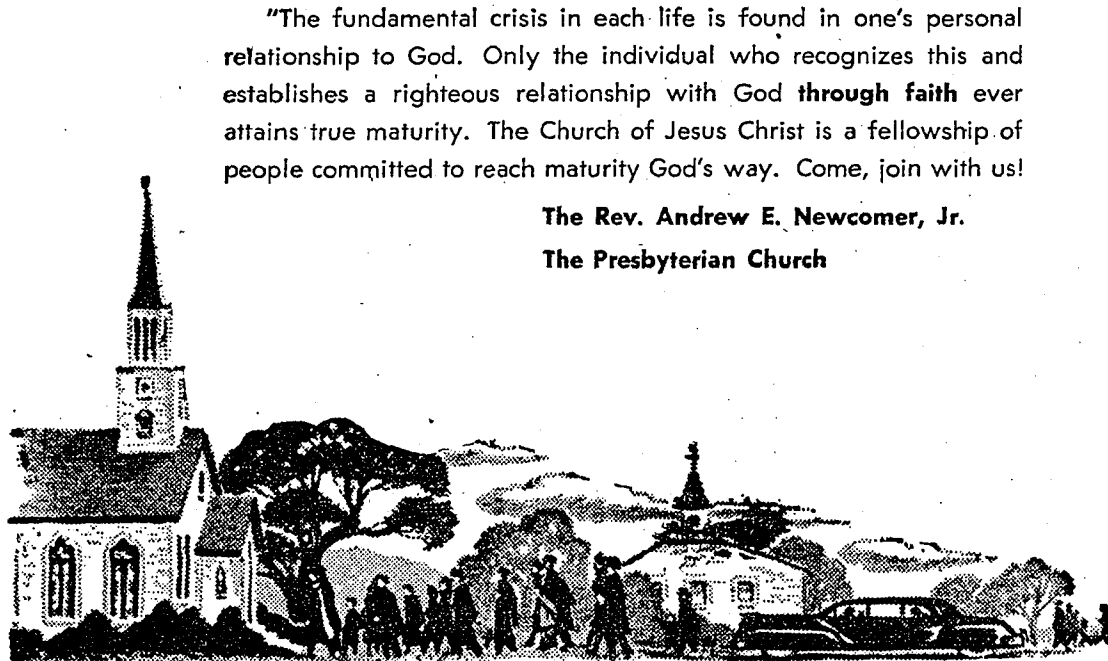
