A prediction of over 5000 signatures for the absentee voting petition was made by David Fitzcharles, chairman of the National Student association committee at the meeting. Fitzcharles reported that 4400 signatures had been obtained up until last night. The drive closes Saturday.

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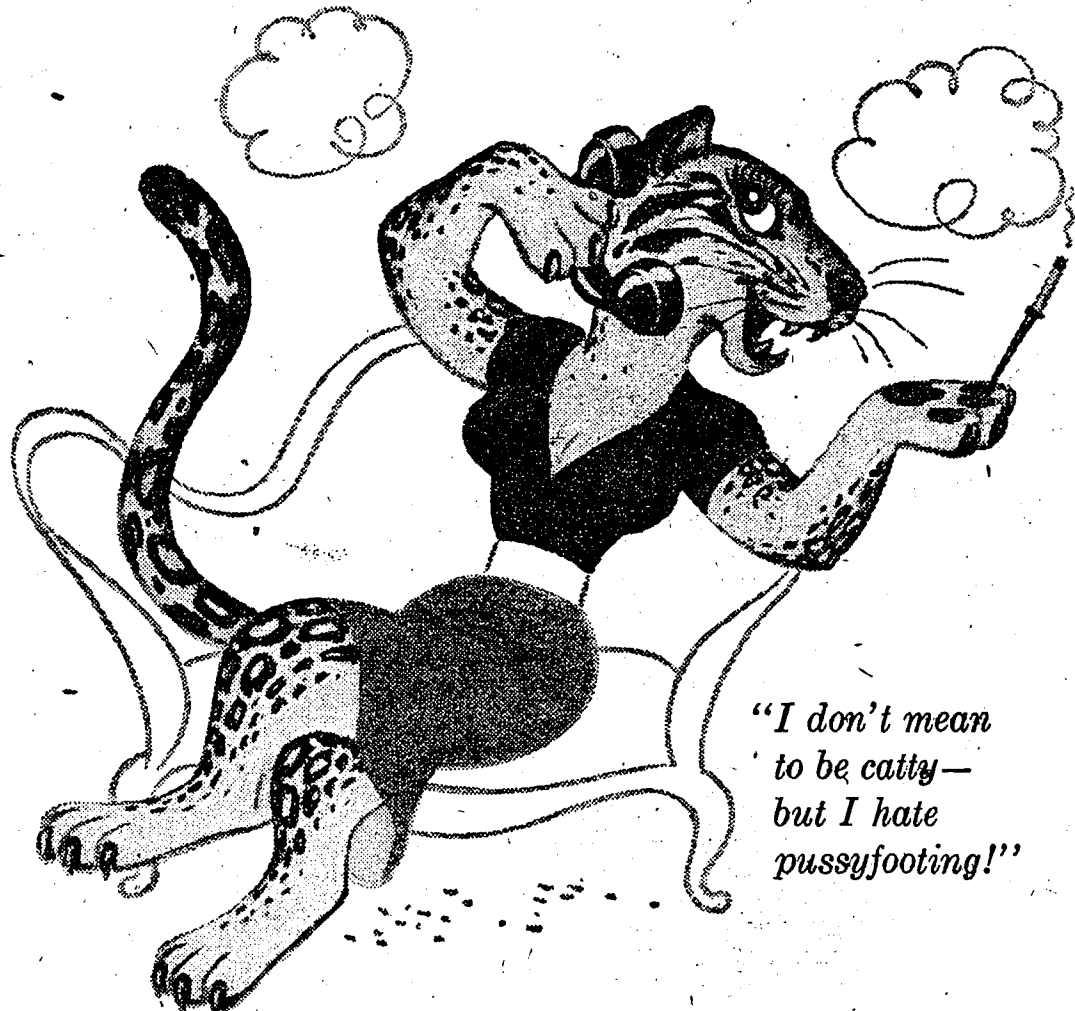
