(Continued from page four) world of Penn State graduates. Formation of the school would also permit even greater at-tention to personnel in the raising of standards.

Thirdly, much subject duplication now evident throughout the College could be reduced or eliminated since the school would be in a better position to arrange its curricula in cooperation with other schools.

A FOURTH ADVANTAGE would be in the stimulant to enrollment that such a school would provide. About one out of every ten students on the campus is enrolled in commerce and finance and the trend is upward. With Penn State's central location and with the prestige of a known and recognized school of business, it is probable that Pennsylvanians and others interested in a business education would flock to the Nittany Vale rather than to ROTC at Pitt and now holds the schools of other universities rank of 2nd Lieutenant in the which are now living solely on Army Quartermaster corps. their reputations.

With enrollment showing a tendency to decline, and con-sidering the desirability of retaining the present staff, now would seem to be the time for action. 
