Gay Brunner, chairman of the judicial, yesterday reminded all women students that they are subject to WSGA rules and regulations when they take overnights in State College.

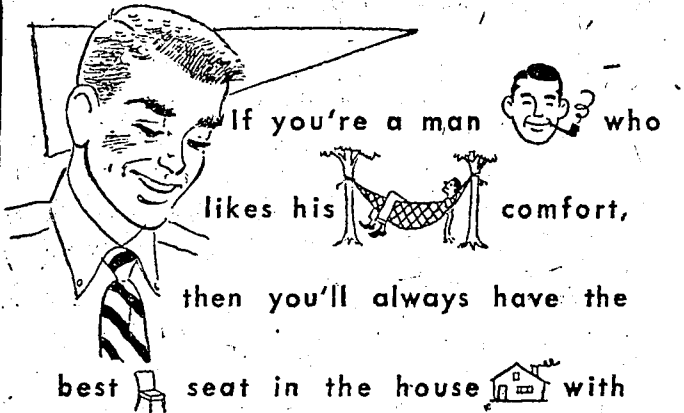

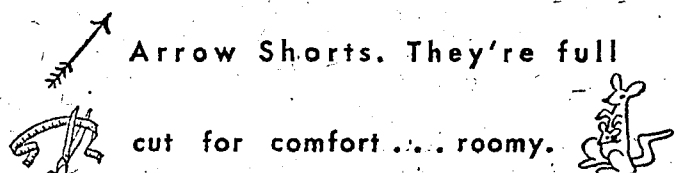
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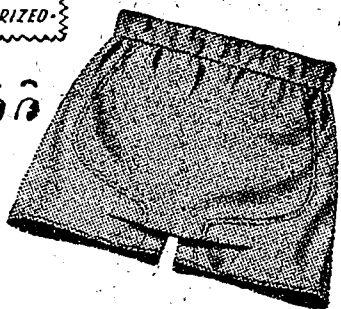
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
