

# 3-Way Tie In Cage Loop F; Full Mat Squad To Vie At Nat'ls AGR-Phi Psi In Acid Test

Alpha Gamma Rho walloped Phi Sigma Kappa Tuesday night, 36-16, to tie Phi Kappa Psi and Alpha Phi Alpha for first place in the fraternity basketball league F. AGR met the Phi Psi's last night. The winner will meet Alpha Phi Alpha tonight for the league title. Saylor's 16 points paved the way for AGR.

Phi Sigma Delta secured top spot in league E when they defeated Sigma Phi Sigma, 16-10 in a pulse-tingling battle. Other contests in league E: Alpha Tau Omega outscored Pi Lambda Phi, 34-27, Delta Upsilon downed Chi Phi, 23-18, and Alpha Chi Sigma fell before Beta Theta Pi, 18-9. Another tilt in league F was Sigma Alpha Epsilon's 16-10 victory over Delta Sigma Phi.

Sigma Phi Epsilon and Beta Sigma Rho met last night to decide the league D championship. Both fives ended the season with an identical 6-1 log.

Assistant wrestling Coach Charlie Ridenour was a three-time Eastern wrestling champion. Ridenour annexed his titles at State in 1941, '42, and '43. His titles were in the 121 and 128-pound classes.

Penn State's championship Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling association squad will field a full team at the National Collegiate Athletic association championships at Lehigh next Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Coach Charlie Speidel said yesterday.

Speidel said that since the nationals are in the East this year, Eastern teams will try to enter as many full teams as they can to battle the powerful mat squads from the West.

### Harbold At 130

Only one change in the lineup that took the EIWA title for the first time since 1942 is expected. Dean Harbold, with a record of 2-2 for the season, will probably wrestle in the 130-pound class for the Lions. Jack Dreibelbis was State's 130-pounder in the EIWA's.

Otherwise the lineup will be

the same. Jack Reese, who entered the quarter-finals before losing to the eventual champion, Lehigh's Mike Filipos, will be the 123 pounder.

### 2nd Time For Maurey

At 136, EIWA champion Don Maurey will go to the nationals for the second time. Don Frey, runnerup to Cornell's Frank Bettucci in the 147-pound class, will be making his debut in the tournament.

At 157 will be Bill Santel and in the 167-pound class sophomore Joe Lemyre, who put on the best match of the tournament with Navy's Don Thomas, will enter national collegiate competition for the first time. Lemyre finished third in the EIWA's.

### Rubino, Barr Compete

Eastern 177-pound champion Mike Rubino will take his title into battle. Captain Homer Barr,

two-time Eastern champion and runner-up this year to Princeton's Brad Glass, will go in the heavyweight division.

Barr last year finished third in the tournament. The other Lion entries, Don Maurey, who wrestled at 128, and Mike Rubino, didn't fare much better. Maurey made it into the quarter finals, while Rubino lost out in the first round. Jim Maurey, captain of last year's team, finished third. The Lions as a team finished eighth in the scoring.

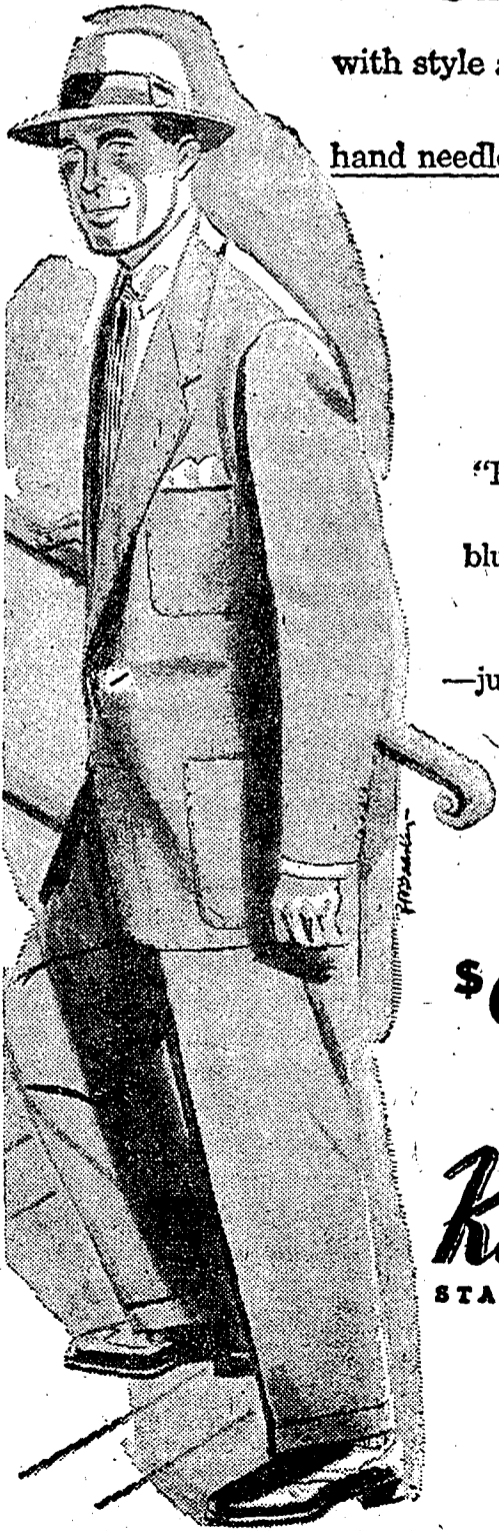
