Until release of this order, deferments for students in the upper half of their class could be granted at the option of individual draft boards. The only national regulation existing was that all students receiving notices to report for physicals were to have induction postponed until the end of the academic year.

One major point still unclear is what will happen to students now attending school under these postponements. Two of the three test dates are after the end of the academic year. No further postponement procedure has as yet been announced.

#### Testing Service

The tests, which will be administered by the Educational Testing Service of Princeton, N. J., will be free. Students will, however, have to pay their own transportation to testing centers. The ETS has conducted examinations for the navy, the State department, the Atomic Energy commission, West Point, and Annapolis.

In addition to graduate students, all students doing satisfactory work in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, osteopathy, and optometry will be automatically deferred.

#### Need Technical Knowledge

Explaining the order, Hershey said he had recently told congress that the United States cannot compete with the Communist countries on the grounds of manpower, and must depend on superior technical knowledge.

"Congress took advantage of this and made provisions to permit the deferment of college and university students in such numbers as may be necessary," Hershey said.

Armed forces manpower requirements have been cut recently because of heavy enlistments and fewer Korean casualties. Last week the army halved its original 80,000 man call for April.

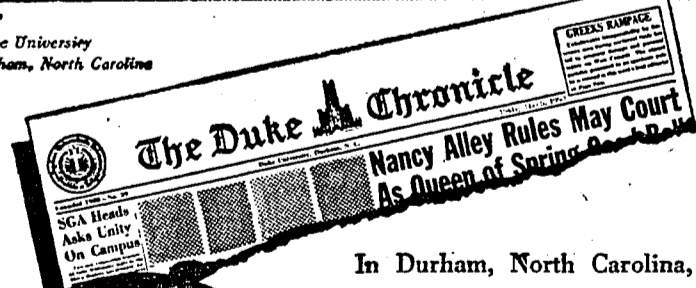
