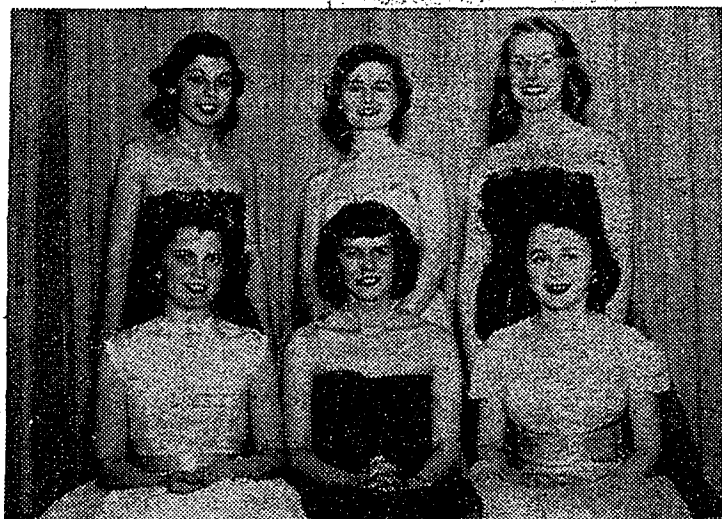


# May Court Candidates

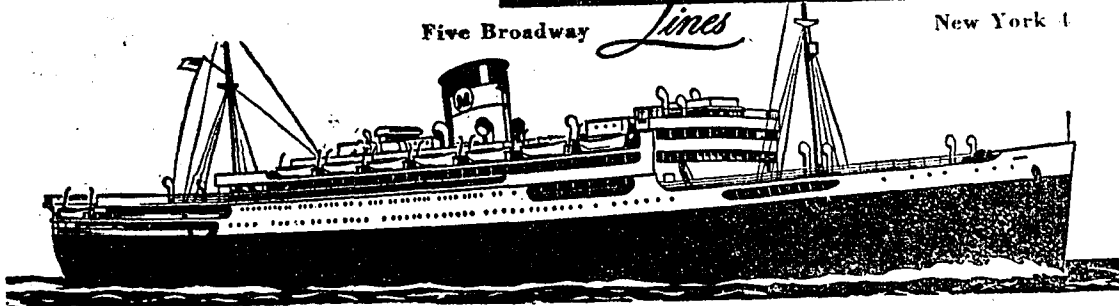
