

# Thinclads Face Navy At Annapolis, Sat.

State's cindermen, as yet untried in dual meet competition, hook up with Navy, at Annapolis, Saturday.

Well balanced in both field and track events, the Middies have won two dual meets. They routed Duke 84-46 and capsized Penn 98-33 earlier this season.

Navy packs a powerful one-two punch in the javelin. Midshipman Bob Allison copped the Penn Relays javelin first place with a throw of 213 feet but against Duke, Allison got off a 225 foot toss. His teammate Gerry Helland threw 203 feet in the Relays to edge State's Ted Roderer by four feet.

### Good Hurdlers

In comparison to the Lions, Navy is strong in the hurdles. The Middies are led by Bob Dettmer who has done the highs in 15 flat, Reeves, a 24.5 low hurdler and Honaker, a legman in Navy's fourth place in the Relay's shuttle hurdle event.

Thus far, the leading hurdler for Coach Werner has been Fred Singer. Fast, but as yet lacking finesse, Singer has been clocked in 15.9. Best time in the 220 lows has been Guy Kay's 23.9.

Discus and shot men for State, Dick Cripps, Bob Krayer and Tom McDermott will have it rough against Navy's Gay and Cameron who have done 45 or better in the shot and Middle Fritz Davis' discus spin of 147 feet.

Vaulter Owen Wilkenson's chief Navy foe will be Morelli who hit 12 and one-half feet against Penn. Last Saturday Wilky did the same height but has reached 13 foot in practice.

### Lions Lack High Jumper

Lacking a broad jumper of anything like Middle Andrew's 23 foot nine inch leap, State chances in this event are nil.

Best in the high jump for the sailors has been Wolcott's 6 foot effort equaled by State's Jim Herb and bettered by Vic Fritts last weekend.

Without any meetings scheduled for them, Norm Gordon's frosh runners and field men are running "telegraphic" meets as a substitute. Time trial races are run among all the freshmen and the best three times are then matched off with opposition frosh.

Running "against" Penn this week, Ollie Sax shaved .3 from his own 440 record set a week ago. He streaked the distance Tuesday in 49.4.

## Athletics Swap Two For Player, Cash

PHILADELPHIA, May 2—(AP)—The Philadelphia Athletics disposed of two players today and received in turn a minor league second baseman and an undisclosed sum of money.

Pitcher Charlie Harris was traded to the Cleveland Indians for Ronald Gifford and cash and rookie infielder Eddie Samcoff was sold to Memphis of the Southern Association. The money involved in the Samcoff deal was not announced.

Gifford, with Wichita, Kans., of the Western League, batted .310 last season. He will be sent to the A's farm at Lincoln, Neb.

# Stickmen Seek Revenge In Coming Syracuse Tilt

Penn State will be seeking its second win this year against Syracuse in varsity sport competition when the Lion lacrosse team battles the Orange this Saturday on the golf course.

The only victory gained by the Lions over the New Yorkers was in wrestling when they won 17-9, at Syracuse.

Outside of that, however, the Lion efforts have been fruitless. They dropped a pair of basketball games to the Orange, 61-59, and 50-46. The boxers lost, 5-3, and the best the gridders could do was a 27-6 loss. The gymnastic team concludes this miserable showing with a 59-37 loss.

### Lost Last Year

Coach Nick Thiel's crew will also be seeking revenge for the 17-3 scalping it received at the hands of Coach Roy Simmons' squad last year at Syracuse.

Last year, Syracuse and Penn State played only two common foes in lacrosse. These were Virginia and Cornell. The New Yorkers split their matches, defeating Cornell, 9-4, but losing to Virginia, 13-7. The Lions, on the other hand, dropped both games when they were mauled by the Virginians, 23-12, and by the Big Red, 9-7.

The other loss by Syracuse was suffered at the hands of a powerful Army squad, 18-12. Other victories were scored over such impressive teams as RPI, Union, Dartmouth, Rutgers, Hobart, and Cortland.

However, this year is another year, and the Orange have lost 15 men via graduation while State has not been affected to a great extent.
