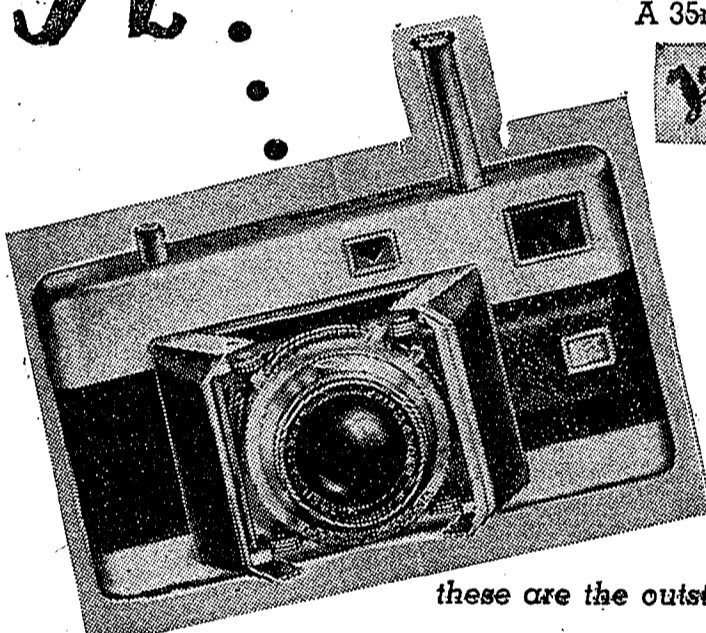
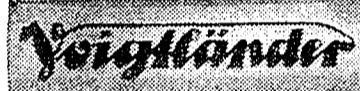
Eileen Olessker and Shirley Gallagher will argue the negative in the second debate, and Joyce Buchanan will be chairman. The same topic will be used.

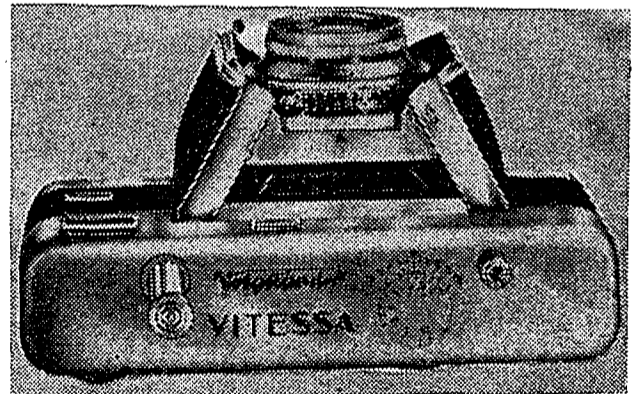

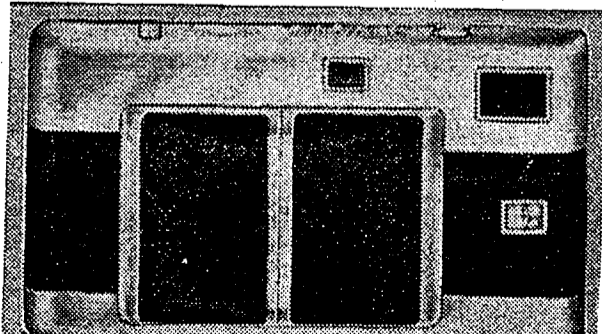
