

Prexy Speaks On Education At Coffee Hour

President Milton S. Eisenhower said at the Agriculture student-faculty coffee hour Wednesday that no educational institution today is fulfilling its obligations to its students unless it is considering both educational and social aspects.

President Eisenhower said that research, courses, and extension here at the College are among the best, but we still need more research. A truly good institution, he said, can never fully meet, all demands, for as fast as demands are met, new demands are made.

Also at the coffee hour, a cup was presented to George Alleman, sophomore ag education student, by Russell B. Dickerson, assistant dean of the School of Agriculture.

The cup is awarded annually by Alpha Zeta fraternity to the outstanding sophomore scholar. Alleman has an All-College average of 2.82.

Previously in the afternoon, President Eisenhower attended a conference of the Great Lakes Farm Cooperative.

The GLF co-op group is holding meetings here until today. This group is composed of GLF representatives from all over the state. The group will tour the campus.

The Navy jets which will leave from Willow Grove Naval Air Station are expected to arrive at 4:20 p.m. in State College.

President Milton S. Eisenhower, chief marshal, who will lead the parade, will be accompanied by Adrian O. Morse, provost; Dr. George L. Haller, dean of the School of Chemistry and Physics and commanding officer of the 153 Aircraft Control and Warning Group; and Robert M. Davis and James B. Worth, retiring and newly-elected All-College presidents, respectively.

Others to march with the President are the following ROTC staff heads at the College: Capt. John L. Woodbury, Navy; Col. Lucien E. Bodluc, Army; Lt. Col. Ernest P. Foley, Marine Corps; and Lt. Col. Jack W. Dieterle, Air Force.

President Eisenhower and his party will march with the parade until they approach the reviewing stand where they will take their places with Cpl. Irvin Moyer, Burgess E. K. Hibshman, and Borough Council President E. L. Keller. The reviewing stand will be located at the main campus gate leading to the Mall at Allen Street.

The route of march is east on Pollock road to Shortlidge road south on Shortlidge road to College avenue to Burrowes road north on Burrowes road to tennis courts, the dismissal point.
