4000 Students Expected To Enroll; Rev. Harshbarger Classes Start At 8 A.M. Tomorrow

Approximately 4000 student men and women are expected to register today in the balcony of Recreation Hall and the second floor of Pattee Library as the forty-second annual Main Summer Session gets under way this morning at 8 a.m.

A total of 2252 students have pre-registered compared to 2301 last year. Because of this drop, the enrollment is expected to be less than that of last year. During the 1950 Main Session the enrollment was 4033.

Four hundred professors will be here to teach the courses offered during the Session.
